Muscles and Bones

Imagine you are running in a race. Your legs are moving quickly. What's happening inside your legs? Your muscles and bones are working together. They are making your legs run.

Skeletal Muscle



Muscles use power and energy to move your body. Some muscles are attached to your bones, and they are called skeletal muscles. They work together with your bones to help you move.



Our bodies need a lot of bones and skeletal muscles to move around. In an adult body, there are 206 bones and over 650 skeletal muscles.

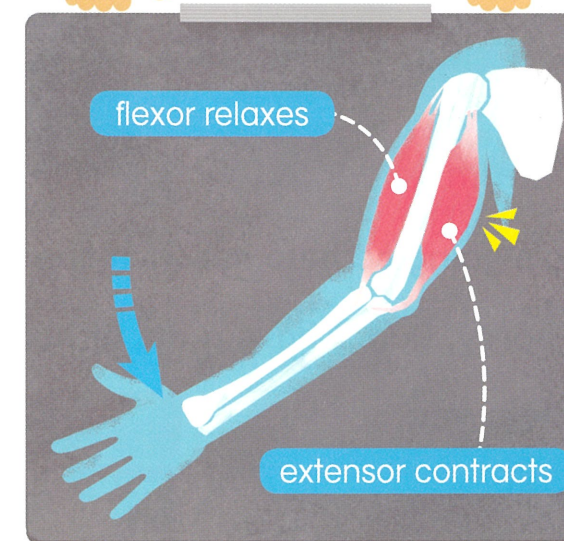
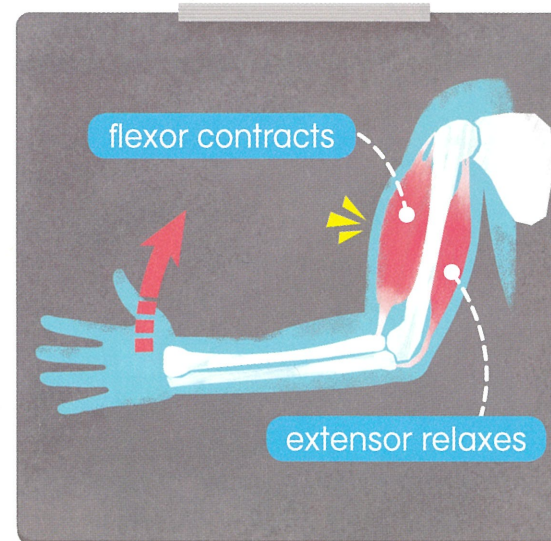

How do muscles help you move?



Muscles work by contracting. That means they get shorter and thicker as they work together. There are two kinds of muscles that control almost all body movements. They are called flexor and extensor muscles. When one muscle contracts, the other muscle relaxes.
