

Permission 許可

You can swim here. (~できる)

You're allowed to park here. (~が許されている)

Obligations 義務

You have to fasten your seat belts. (~しなければならない) You've got to take off your shoes. (~しなければならない)

Prohibition 禁止

You can't turn left. (~できない) Pets **aren't allowed** in this area. (~は許されない)

Use have/has with got to: You have got to keep the door closed. 「~しなければならない」got toは haveまたはhas と共に使う。 × You got to keep the door closed.
